The Revival Golf Club is simply "a must play", and sure to test every club in your bag. Among the many memorable holes on this superb layout are the par 3-8th hole, a signature shot over water to a wide, shallow green. The par 5-6th requires the most demanding, accurate drive on the course, but is reachable in two for long hitters. The approach is guarded by water and bunkers, ensuring that players of all levels will be challenged with classic risk/reward decision making.


On the back nine, players will be struck by par 4-12th hole with the huge live oak tree nestled on the left side of the fairway, and the elevation changes of the par 4-16th hole with its steeply elevated green.



Practice Area

The Revival practice area has a full size 7 acre driving range. The natural grass facility separates The Revival from other courses. You will also find two large short game practice greens.









Using This Book

Before you start your next round of golf, take a moment to look through this yardage book. Pay attention to the hazards, playing tips, and basic yardage information to help yourself get a feel for the course. When you go to play each hole review the playing tip for helpful hints.



Look for landmarks like trees, bunkers, or curves in the fairway to align your shots with and reference the yardage measurements as a tool to help you decide which clubs will be best to use.

As you play the hole, you can make notes on the pages of this book for yourself. Next time you come to play our course, you will have a personalized guide to playing your best!



The round begins with a strong, uphill par 5. Deep bunkers guard the right side of the green, making an approach shot from the left side of the fairway more desirable. The large green is divided by a ridge in the center, so distance control is essential.






Accuracy off the tee is paramount on this short par 4. A tee shot that works right to left will chase down the fairway, leaving a short iron approach to a very deep and undulating green. Guard against going long on your approach as there is out of bounds behind the green.





A solid tee shot that avoids the bunkers off the tee will set up a mid-to long iron approach. The second shot plays slightly uphill to a small, difficult to hit green. Anything landing short of the green will kick right towards the penalty area. With a bunker and out of bounds guarding the green, par is always a great score.





This beautiful, short part 5 has no bunkers, and boasts a generous landing area. A tee shot that finishes just right of center will leave you a level lie from which you can attack the pin. At 44 yards deep, this is a 3-club green divided by valley in the middle. A solid approach will give you a great look at birdie.





Tee shots landing just left of the green often kick right, making this a safe bailout to avoid the bunkers and creek to the right. A ridge divides the green, making distance control a point of emphasis. A tee shot which moves slightly left to right will give you the best chance to get it close.





The narrow driving area requires accuracy off the tee to avoid the penalty areas right and left. A tee shot favoring the left side of the fairway provides a better angle for your approach. A creek to the right runs the entire length of the hole and feeds the greenside pond. Avoid these hazards, and birdie is a real possibility.






Less than driver is the savvy play off the tee; making sure to avoid both the bunkers and pond. An accurate tee shot will leave a short iron approach to a generous green complex. Guard against going long, as the penalty area is only a yard behind the green. Putts on this green will break more than they appear.





This picturesque par 3 is the signature hole at The Revival. Inspired by the 12th hole at Augusta, it can be both beauty and beast. The narrow green requires an accurate mid to short iron from the tee. Take care to avoid the mounds behind the green, as they leave a difficult chip to a green that feeds towards the pond.






Another hole where less than driver from the tee is the prudent play. The large oak tree in the distance provides a wonderful target off the tee. The approach shot plays slightly uphill, so make sure to take enough club to avoid the deep bunker on the right side of the green. Putts on this green tend to break towards the water short and right of the green.







The longest of the par 3's, the 10th hole requires an accurate mid to long iron shot to a shallow green that slopes back to front. The tee shot plays slightly uphill, and is often into the wind. Players should avoid the deep bunkers short and right of the green.





This hole is all about accuracy. The driving area narrows the closer you get to the green, making the tee shot a risk-reward decision. The generous green complex has no bunkers, but the false front and steep banks make accuracy paramount. Make sure to keep your approach below the hole.





This downhill par 4 gives players options off the tee, though the large oak in the left center of the fairway must be avoided. A tee shot that challenges the left side of the fairway, opens up the green for a much easier approach shot. The large, undulating green demands distance control from the approach.






This medium-length par 4 plays more uphill then it appears, and the elevated green requires both distance control and accuracy. The fairway slopes left to right, so a right to left shot is the prudent play. Players will likely find themselves with an uneven lie in the fairway, adding to the challenges of the approach.





A true risk-reward par 5. A solid tee shot favoring the left-center of the fairway will leave a long iron or fairway wood approach to this large, hourglass shaped green. Players must guard against going long, as there is a penalty area behind the green. If the player chooses to lay up, the large fairway bunker must be avoided.



A visually intimidating par 3, the 15th hole will test your iron game. The large green angles away from the tee making the hole play very different based on the pin location. The bunker long and left leaves a tough up and down, as everything runs towards the pond. Center of the green is always a good play on this hole.

A tee shot that challenges the right side of the narrow fairway will kick towards the center and roll out more. The elevated green plays about two clubs longer than the yardage, and the bunker left leaves a difficult recovery. Putts on this green will break more than they appear.







A tee shot that challenges the bunker on the left makes this an easily reachable par 5. The uphill approach will cause shots to release more on and around the green, with any shot missing right likely finding the woods. The prudent miss is short left of the green, leaving a straightforward pitch.





The left-center of the fairway provides players with a better angle into the narrow and deep green, but be cautious of the out of bounds left. The approach is semi-blind, but the trademark silo serves as a great reference point from the fairway. The green narrows in the middle, so distance control on the approach is key.

Course Rules

THE REVIVAL GOLF CLUB COURSE RULES AND INFORMATION:

U.S.G.A. Rules govern all play

- . All players must register in the Pro Shop prior to play.
- Daily pin placements are indicated by numbers located in each cart window
- Yardages marked on the course are measured to the center of the green.
- Proper pace of play is 4 hours.
- Out of bounds is defined by white stakes and paved streets.
- Wetlands are considered Lateral Water Hazards as defined by red stakes or lines. Drop a ball within two club lengths of the hazard, no nearer the hole, at the point the original ball last crossed the hazard, one stroke penalty. (Rule 26-1)
- Cart operators must have a valid driver's license.
- Carts must remain on paths unless otherwise noted on #1 tee. Always keep carts on paths around tees, greens, and all par 3's. Do not drive carts on steep slopes.
- Please respect private property around the golf course.
- A collared shirt is required. No denim is allowed.
- Personal coolers and glass bottles are not permitted on the course or at the clubhouse.
- Please sand your divots, repair all ball marks, and rake bunkers.
- Planted mulched areas equal a free drop closest point of relief no nearer the hole.
- Local Rule: Hole #8 drop area is located in front of Ladies' tee box.
